## Johnson City Center for Art & Technology

Create Appalachia's Johnson City Center opened in November 2022. It includes private offices and cubicles, coworking space, conference room, computer lab and streaming media lab with 24/7 digital key access for members. A video/motion capture studio with green screen and photo studio will be completed in the spring of 2024. The Center is within walking distance of East Tennessee State University and downtown Johnson City and has ample free parking.

## Kingsport Center for Art & Technology




In its first year, the 12-seat computer lab with digital-media-ready computers hosted middle schoolers learning 2D animation, downtown business owners learning how to maximize their social media presence, and more.

The Kingsport Center for Art & Technology (KCAAT) provides a number of resources to meet the needs of creative entrepreneurs, small businesses, and nonprofits. There are private offices, coworking spaces, and also private cubicles with digitalmedia-ready software curated for digital creators. Everything is priced affordably. Memberships include 24/7 access and discounted use of a private conference room, casual meeting spaces, full computer lab, streaming media lab, giclee print lab, and an art gallery. A small product photography lab is upstairs. Located in the heart of downtown, KCAAT is part of Kingsport's Innovation Village with plenty of free parking in the adjacent lot and garage.



The arts@work series focuses on professional development for creative entrepreneurs, especially business and digital skills. Most sessions are free or by donation. Some are fee based. Scholarships are also available.

## Community partnerships are effective ways to work toward mutual goals,

and Create Appalachia is privileged to work with many arts, entrepreneurship, economic development, and educational groups in our region. Here are just a few of those collaborations:

- In December 2023, a partnership with Kingsport YMCA powered two weeks of 2D Animation classes for middle school students. This <u>student interview</u> and the <u>finished animation short</u> help communicate the impact.
- As part of the Innovation Village, Create Appalachia supported Engage Kingsport in the promotion of The G.O.A.T. Festival arts event by sponsoring a Tiny Art Throwdown and participating in the Community Mural project.
- Create Appalachia worked with member and project partner Sync
   Space to provide several classes and initiatives to help creative businesses, including the Freelance Academy and Entrepreneur Bootcamp.
- As part of the Central Appalachian
   Living Traditions team, Create
   Appalachia was able to provide direct
   support for branding, website design,
   and marketing expertise to folk arts
   and culture professionals in Southwest
   Virginia.





## memberships

Create Appalachia membership types offer tiers of amenities especially designed to support entrepreneurs, start-ups, and small businesses—particularly in the creative businesses. Memberships can be customized to meet specific needs, but categories include:

**Community Members:** Free membership that gets you in the information loop via the monthly e-newsletter.

**Mailing Address Membership:** A physical mailing address for your business at \$40/month. Access during business hours.

**Student Memberships:** Free 10-day coworking punch pass for students over 18 years of age, student ID required. Discounted Flexdesk memberships after trial (starting at \$4/day in packages) with access to any open desk or computer. Bring your own storage device.

**Individual and Company Memberships:** An annual membership that gives individuals (\$125/year) or companies (\$225-\$425/year depending on company size) member rates on amenities and services.

**Punch Pass Memberships:** Use-as-you-need day passes, purchase as single day pass (\$25), or in bundles for deeper discounts (5 days/\$100 or 10 days/\$150). Use in one year. Great for a special project or seasonal work. Access to any open desk or computer. Bring your own storage device.

Flex Desk 24/7 Memberships: This option gives the member access to any open desk or computer any time, with 24/7 digital key access to the location of choice. \$200/month, with discounts for 3+ month commitments.

**Dedicated Cubicles:** A membership with personal, dedicated space and lockable storage. Options with computer and software

start at \$250/month. Cubicles without computer start at \$200/month. Discounts \$50/month for 6+ month commitments. Limited inventory.


**Private Office Memberships:** Private offices are available for members in either Kingsport or Johnson City location—lockable, private spaces, many with windows. Bring your own furniture or add a furniture package. Costs range from \$300/month to \$495/month with all utilities and Internet access included. Discounts for 6+ month commitment. Limited inventory.

Member Amenities and Services: Members (except community and mailing address levels) receive discounts on Conference Rooms, Streaming Media Studios, Print Lab, Computer Labs, Product Photo Studio, Video/Photo Studio. Private office memberships include 4 hours/month Conference Room or Streaming Media Studio use; private cubicle members enjoy 2 hours/month included in their membership.


